Section D.

Current:

Department members shall not request passports, visas, "green cards," or other documents relating to one's immigration status in lieu of, or in addition to, standard forms of identification such as a driver's license, state identification card, etc. Immigration related documents shall only be requested when standard forms of identification are unavailable, or when the member is proceeding under (F) below.

Proposed:

Department members should not request passports, visas, "green cards," or other documents relating to one's immigration status in lieu of, or in addition to, standard forms of identification such as a driver's license, state identification card, etc. Immigration related documents shall only be requested when standard forms of identification are unavailable, or when the member is proceeding under (F) below.

Acceptable:

Immigration related documents such as but not limited to, passports, visas, and "green cards" shall only be requested when standard forms of identification are unavailable, or when the member is proceeding under (F) below.

- 1. Is charged with a felony.
- 2. Is charged with a misdemeanor involving the possession or use of a dangerous weapon.
- 3. Is charged for a terrorism-related offense, or is otherwise reasonably suspected of involvement in terrorism and/or subversive activities.
- 4. Is charged with an offense involving the entry or fraudulent assimilation of undocumented foreigners into the country, or is reasonably suspected of participating in an organized venture to bring or fraudulently assimilate undocumented foreigners into the country.
- 5. Is a previously deported felon.

Section G.

Current:

In the event a police member needs to contact ICE, they shall first attempt to contact the local office at 414-297-1571. If the local office is closed or if an agent is unavailable, the police member shall contact the ICE Law Enforcement Support Center (LESC) at 1-802-872-6050.

Proposed:

In the event a police member needs to contact ICE, they shall contact their shift commander and provide them with the pertinent information. The member may then attempt to contact the local office at 414-297-1571. If the local office is closed or if an agent is unavailable, the police member shall contact the ICE Law Enforcement Support Center (LESC) at 1-802-872-6050.
